



TBI Clinical Educator – Tampa FL

Position Summary:

The TBI Nurse Educator serves as the Subject Matter Expert (SME) for pre-deployment/deployment education training. S/he provides training and education relating to TBI.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities: (Not listed in order of importance; other duties may be assigned)

- Serve as SME for pre-deployment/deployment education training.
- Assist in the development of plans, designs, manages, and carries out actions to accomplish assigned program areas.
- Provide input during strategic planning for TBI and PH clinical, research, resilience and training programs.
- Interface with DoD/VA/DVBIC/DCoE leaders, TMA and OASDHA requests and provides input in response to taskers related to TBI.
- Conduct briefings within and outside of DVBIC/DoD/VA/DCoE on matters related to TBI as requested/directed.
- Serve as a technical advisor for deployment related education program development, administration and evaluation .
- Provide input in the formulation and establishment of policy and objectives.
- Provide expert advice on program requirements and procedures to all Services requiring such programs.
- Assist in the establishment of criteria by which resilience programs are evaluated and assessed.
- Assist in the planning of program reviews to evaluate the effectiveness of specific resilience programs to ensure they meet the criteria and are in compliance with regulations and laws.

Qualifications:

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill and ability required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

Education and/or Experience:

- Master's degree in a nursing specialty or allied health science is preferred.
- Degree or diploma from a professional nursing program, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant approved by the legally designated State accrediting agency at the time the program was completed by the applicant preferred.
- A minimum of 5 years of experience post Masters working in TBI programs required. Experience in managing DoD, national, state or regional-wide TBI clinical programs within the DoD/VA/Federal Health System strongly preferred.
- Experience working with or in United States Special Operations Command strongly preferred.

Required Licenses:

Prefer registered nursing license, nurse practitioner license or licensed physician assistant.

Knowledge:

- Proficient in MS Office suite of products (strong emphasis on PowerPoint), Publisher, Analyst Notebook.
- Previous knowledge of Wounded Warrior Operational support preferred.
- Knowledge of TBI and education programs required.
- Expertise with researching and tracking legislation required Ability to analysis of mental health and social service programs and policies as they relate to federal health programs.



- Mastery of advanced specialized nursing theories, principles, concepts, and practices to serve as a technical authority by providing expert advice and direction in program development, management, and evaluation required.
- Demonstrates research abilities specific to DoD TBI health care services and programs.
- Must adhere to legal, professional and ethical codes with respect to confidentiality and privacy.

Abilities:

- Strong interpersonal skills.
- Ability to quickly assess varied situations and assist in development of solutions working with team members.
- Ability to organize, prioritize and meet deadlines.
- Critical thinking and analytic skills to translate research findings into policy required.
- Self-starter requiring minimal supervision.
- Strong verbal and written communication to effectively express concepts plans, and proposals for a wide range of audiences required.
- Ability to work in an ambiguous environment.
- Develop and maintain effective working relationships with others.
- Team-building, leadership, and diplomatic communication required.
- Ability to interpret and follow oral instructions.
- Able to adapt to changes in schedules and job priorities.
- Able to perform detailed work with a high degree of accuracy.
- Able to read and interpret written information.
- Able to calculate mathematical problems involving addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- Able to analyze problems and develop viable solutions.
- Able to conduct research and reconcile inaccuracies and make appropriate corrections.
- Ability to analysis of mental health and social service programs and policies as they relate to federal health programs.

NOTE: While performing the duties of this job, the employee is frequently required to stand; walk; sit; use hands to finger, handle, or feel objects, tools or controls; reach with hands and arms; climb stairs and/or ladders; balance; stoop, kneel, crouch or crawl; talk, hear or smell. The employee must occasionally lift and/or move up to 50 pounds occasionally or 20 pounds frequently. Specific vision abilities required by the job include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and the ability to adjust focus. Valid state driver's license and ability to operate a motor vehicle required. May encounter patients who are confused, agitated, or abusive.

Work Environment:

Office, clinical and hospital environment. Must be available to travel locally, regionally and nationally.

Clearance:

Secret Clearance required. Candidates may be subject to a government security investigation and must meet eligibility requirements for access to classified information upon hire.
